About Hills of Gold Wind Farm

The project is located 8km south-east of Nundle in NSW, at the head of the Peel Valley on the Great Dividing Range. It spans three local government areas including Tamworth Regional Council, Upper Hunter Shire Council, and Liverpool Plains Shire Council.

The project involves the construction, operation and commissioning of a wind farm with up to 62 wind turbines which will generate up to 372 MW of clean, affordable and reliable energy, enough to power 163,000 Australian homes.

About Someva

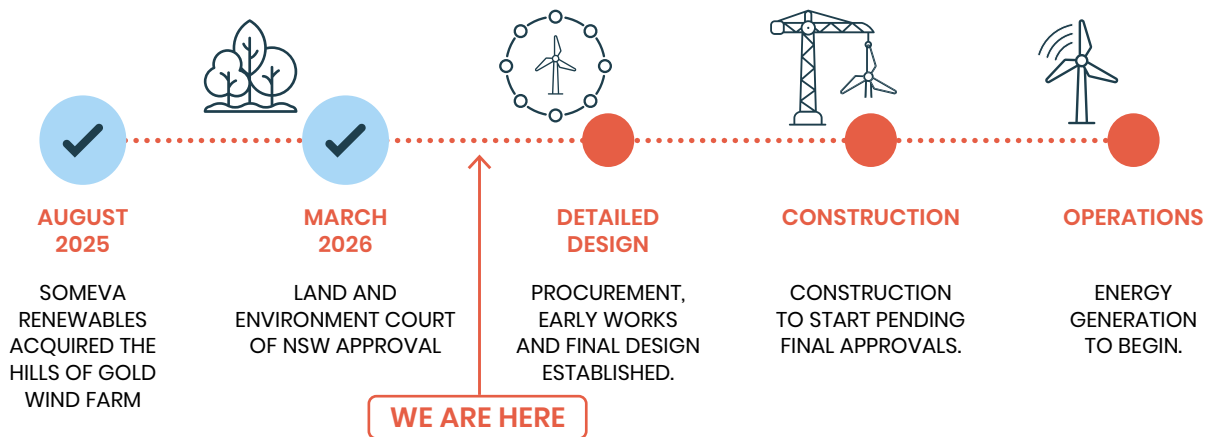
